Lucky for Border fanciers with a variety of interests - hunting, obedience, tracking, and companion dogs, as well as the often over-emphasized conformation showing.

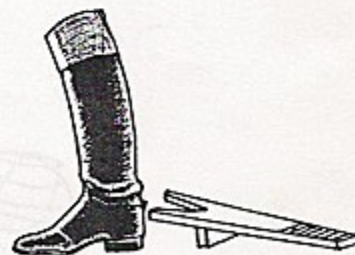

**NOTES AND NEWS**

We heard from member **Kate Irving** that **Ronnie Irving** had drawn an entry of approximately 350 Borders for his judging assignment at the Southern Border Terrier Club Championship show, to be held June 12th at Cheltenham Racecourse (U.K.). Hard to even imagine seeing so many Borders, much less judging them!

It is interesting to note that while judging the **Montpelier Border Terrier Rally** this April, judge **Bob Naun** found a point of agreement with his wife **Ruth Ann Naun**. Bob found as **Best of Breed** a red dog handled by a young lady that he did not recognize. The dog, **Ch. Krispin Casey of Slade Run**, owned by **Martha Duke** and shown by her daughter, is the sire of **Ch. Slade Run Bold as Brass**, the dog named **Best of Breed** by Ruth Ann when she judged the 1992 BTCA National Specialty.

Speaking of the **Montpelier Rally**, it has been noted with sadness that **Ed and Hope Levy**, who have been the organizers for seven years, have said that this will be their last year with the event. With its lush Virginia scenery, historic setting, and low-key atmosphere, the Rally has been a springtime focal point for Border fanciers for years. One would hope that others feel similar emotion for Montpelier and that the event is not allowed to become extinct.

**Congratulations** are in order to two of our members whose dogs have recently had notable wins in the show ring:

On May 29th, at Merrimac Kennel Club show, judge **Fred Ferris** awarded a Group 1 to **Ch. Rogue's Resolute**, owned by **Kate Seemann** and handled by **Jim Dickson**. The following day, at Rockingham Co. Kennel Club, **Ch. Rogue's Resolute** was awarded a Group 1 by judge **Charles Meyer** and went on to win the **Best in Show** award from judge **Janice Knight**. **Kate Seemann** is no stranger to the **Best in Show** award, but it must nevertheless have been a thrill to win with a homebred dog.

One week later, at Framingham District Kennel Club, **Georgette Tosca's** import **Br. Am. Ch. Lyndhay Daz** won the Group 1 under judge **Robert Graham**.

We were pleased to hear from **Kate Seemann** that her youngest daughter **Deenie Galipeau** has added a new Shelburne Border Terrier to her home at Highest Acres Farm in Shelburne, Vermont. A wonderful advertisement entitled "Shelburne Borders Return to Their Roots" in the dog magazine "D" shows Border puppy "Crooker" introducing herself to 17 1/2 year-old Border **Dazzling Demon of Dalquest** and standing in line with resident Maine Coon cats at the dinner bowl.

We learned recently from **BTCA President Margaret Pough** that the 1996 BTCA National Specialty will be hosted by the Great Lakes Border Terrier Club and held in mid-July of that year in the vicinity of Columbus, Ohio.

An article published by **Jack Perry** in the Monday, May 24, 1993 'Cape Cod Times' illustrated the extraordinary length that dog owners sometimes go for their pets. **Ann Lewis**, a 39-year-old resident of West Barnstable, MA was struck by an oncoming passenger train as she rescued her 4 1/2 month old Border terrier 'Smokie' from the railroad tracks. The unleashed pup had dashed onto the track as his owner heard the train whistle. Although the accident could easily have been fatal, **Ms. Lewis** was cut in the head only and required 17 stitches. The Border Terrier remained unharmed.
